



Adam is currently employed at the University of Edinburgh as the Senior Database Curator for the International Union of Basic and Clinical Pharmacology (IUPHAR)/British Pharmacological Society (BPS) Guide to PHARMACOLOGY database (GtoPdb; <http://guidetopharmacology.org>). Under the guidance of NC-IUPHAR (the IUPHAR Committee on Receptor Nomenclature and Drug Classification) and over 700 experts worldwide, and with funding from the BPS and Wellcome Trust, Adam works with a team of developers and curators to undertake the annotation of the pharmacological, physiological and genetic properties of human and rodent receptors, ion channels and other drug targets, together with the substances that act on them, from the primary literature and external resources, to drive the development of GtoPdb, a database for information on the targets of licensed drugs and other targets of current

research interest, such as those linked to human disease. Adam was previously employed as a research scientist at the Medical Research Council Human Reproductive Sciences Unit in Edinburgh, initially as a Wellcome Trust Postdoctoral Research Fellow, and later as a Senior Investigator Scientist leading a small team. He received his PhD in Chemical Pathology from the University of Cape Town in 1999.
